Bee Waggle Dance




BEE WAGGLE DANCE ACTIVITY

Animals communicate in different ways than humans do. Bees do a waggle dance to communicate with each other. They can tell each other where the best nectar and flowers are by dancing.

BEFORE WE BEGIN

Watch the YouTube video of a waggle dance so the students become familiar with the movements of a bee.



We will modify the complex movements of a bee for this game. Let them practise being a bee. They can walk while they wiggle.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BE A BEE

- · Have students waggle in the direction of the flower to show where the flower is located.
- · To show the distance of the flower, have the students modify the number of waggles. One waggle = one big step.
- · Have the students waggle more energetically if there is a lot of nectar in the flower.

Use colour ribbon or a similar item to be the "flowers." Place them around the classroom.

ACTIVITY INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Assign one student to be the bee. The other students will close their eyes or leave the classroom.
- 2. Point to a "flower" in the room and let the "bee" student know if it has a little or a lot of nectar. This is the flower the student will try to get their classmates to find.
- 3. The student will waggle towards the flower (without going to it) and do as many loops/figure 8's as the number of steps it takes to get to the flower. Once the student is done, let the class guess which flower it is.
- 4. Repeat with different flower and bees.

If the weather is nice, try this activity outside!
