Program Highlights

Little Green Thumbs & Little Green Sprouts

For over 10 years, Little Green Thumbs has helped students and teachers across Canada become food producers right in their own classroom. Gardens are living laboratories that help inspire students to wonder, question, experiment and construct their understanding of the world around them. AITC-SK manages the national Little Green Thumbs Hub and provides support to organizations in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Newfoundland and New Brunswick to deliver the program.

In 2019, Little Green Sprouts became the official junior gardening program to Little Green Thumbs. A new Little Green Sprouts logo was launched, and the teacher manual was updated to bring this program to it's full potential. Little Green Sprouts is a small–scale gardening program that focuses on growing micro–greens, lettuce and herbs while still offering ample learning opportunities for young students.

Both programs offer students the opportunity to learn about where their food comes from. By being directly responsible for growing and harvesting food, students have a better understanding, appreciation and respect for the food they eat.

Canadian Agriculture Literacy Month (CALM)

During March, Agriculture in the Classroom organizations across Canada celebrate agriculture through programming designed to help students learn about, connect to and understand agriculture. In Saskatchewan, we coordinated classroom visits with volunteers from the agriculture community to provide students with the opportunity to learn about where their food comes directly from those involved in producing it. By creating this personal connection for students, we are building trust and respect for Saskatchewan agriculture in our future consumers. Last year, we reached an incredible 9,192 students through CALM who were inspired from hearing our volunteer's personal agriculture stories.




Food Waste & YOU!

To support Canadian Agriculture Literacy Month, we developed a new resource where students learn about food waste in Canada. Students explore how food is lost or wasted throughout the food value chain, and what the agriculture industry is currently doing to reduce loss and waste. The resource includes a fun activity to see what type of taster students are, and how their personal tastes and actions could contribute to reducing food waste. At the end of their learning, students take the 'Food Waste Pledge' where they vow to follow five action items that will help them personally reduce food waste.

thinkAG Career Quest

Our team developed and successfully piloted an exciting new career game for High School students, thinkAG Career Quest is an innovative and exciting approach to educating students about careers. This gamified learning experience encourages students to explore how people working in a diversity of agriculture careers help solve social, environmental and economic issues. They use their own interests and goals to earn points for their team, and ultimately begin to see how their interests and goals fit in to a role in agriculture, thinkAG Career Quest's innovative concept is being expanded nationally in partnership with AITC-Canada and will be available to teachers across the country.

Gateway to the Classroom

Teacher Agriculture Expedition

In August we connected 20 teachers with agriculture over a three-day, 750-kilometer Agriculture Expedition through west-central Saskatchewan. Teachers experienced first-hand the sights, smells and sounds of farms and agri-businesses where they learned about ingredients grown and raised in our province, and more importantly about the people involved in producing these ingredients. There was teacher representation from communities across the province, as well as from all grade and subject levels. We showcased the diversity of agriculture in Saskatchewan and the beauty of our province.

Teachers are consumers too, and through the expedition they were able to feel the passion that producers have for growing safe and healthy food, and to understand that growing food is their livelihood. This experience has built meaningful connections between AITC-SK and the teachers, and ultimately these teachers have become champions for what we do and the knowledge they have gained will influence students for years to come.

Biotechnology Professional Development Workshop

We want to empower high school teachers with knowledge and tools to help them teach science with confidence. In September, we hosted a Biotechnology Professional Development Workshop where teachers expanded their understanding of biotechnology research and innovation in Saskatchewan. Teachers were given the tools to answer student's questions, easily connect real-life examples to textbook examples, and inspire students to consider a career in biosciences!


Message from the Chair
